It's called *ordinary* for a reason; after the high holy days of Pentecost and Trinity Sunday, things calm down a bit. But here at Emmanuel there is still much to celebrate! Here's what on the liturgical menu for summer 2023!



May 28, 8:00 & 10:00 am The Feast of Pentecost, Whitsunday Holy Eucharist

This **RED-LETTER DAY** celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles in Jerusalem and is also considered to be the birthday of the Church. The scripture from the Book of Acts will be read in tongues (as many languages as we can muster!) Remember to wear RED!

June 4, 8:00 & 10:00 am Trinity Sunday/Youth Sunday/Blessing of the Bicycles

On this high holy day of the church calendar, we are reprising **The Blessing of the** Bicycles!

Come in your bike gear, park you bike or trike in the Parish Hall! Bikes will be "baptized" and riders blessed! Young members will read the lessons and the children's choir will sing! Renovation Team Update:

In October of 2021, the aptly named entirely volunteer Renovation Team, was created to work on implementing recommendations presented by Ministry Architects, a consulting firm under contract with the Vestry to "reimagine" our Children and Youth Ministries. This dedicated team spent the next 18 months committed to the task at hand. The team consisted of Courtney Keplinger, Chris Piemonte, Kate Bartholomay, Kelly Dresen, Ruth Bilodeau, and Meredith Wade (Sr. Warden/Vestry Liaison) and met monthly by Zoom. Initially, the Team was charged with helping to "renovate" the programs and assist with the process of hiring a Director of Spiritual Formation for Children and Youth. As the search continued longer than originally expected, it pivoted to designing and supporting what programming we could launch in spite of pandemic restrictions. It also began the work of preparing for the new staff member, creating background documents and systems that will be utilized by the Director. (A separate committee is continuing the search process with leadership from Ministry Architects).

What follows is a list of Renovation Team accomplishments (the result of a lot of homework):

- Provided seminal input into the first draft of the position description for the Director of Spiritual Formation for Children and Youth.
- Coordinated the Vision Summit, engaging more than 30 members of the congregation in dialogue about the future of the ministry.
- Played the central role in the process of crafting a children's and youth ministry mission statement, core values, and goals.
- **Mission Statement:** The Mission of the Children's and Youth Ministries is to love, engage, inspire, and support the children and youth in the parish, in order to nurture their growth as individuals and as members of the parish and the greater community.
- Core Values: Faith, Family, Honesty, Loyalty, Community, Acceptance, Inclusion, and Fun
- For the new Director, created a plan for welcoming new families, children, and youth to Emmanuel when they come for the first time.
- For the new Director, created a care and contact plan for children and families as well as for youth and their families.
- With the help of the Rev. Grace Pratt, developed a plan to provide Sunday morning Bridges to Worship for children and some youth events while regular programming was still limited by the COVID-19 pandemic. virtually the second semester.

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• Developed a plan for recalibrating youth ministry at Emmanuel post-pandemic and launching it as CHAOS (Christ, Hope, And Occasional Snacks).

- For the new Director, developed a "fishing pond" list of over 40 people that could be approached to participate in the children's or youth ministries.
- Kept an attentive eye on the children's and youth ministries during the lengthy season of being without a children's ministry staff person and with pandemic related challenges.

We cannot thank them this team enough for all of their time, talent, and energy to move our Children and Youth programs forward.
