Sundays in Lent: The Penitential Order & Holy Eucharist

February 26 thru March 26, 8:00 & 10:00 am

During Lent you'll discover, not surprisingly, the prayer of confession comes first. This prayerful litany at the beginning of the service is called the Penitential Order, a call and response form of the Ten Commandments, it encourages us to "incline our hearts to keep God's law."

The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday

April 2, 8:00 & 10:00 am

On this Sunday we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem with the Liturgy of Palms and bear witness to his sacrifice on the cross as we listen to the Passion of Christ according to Matthew.

Maundy Thursday

April 6, 7:00 pm— in person

The Maundy is the act of humility, repentance, and renewal which reminds worshippers of their Baptism, and of the identification with Jesus Christ in his death, of which the Passion is the solemn commemoration. It brings to its conclusion the penitential discipline of Lent and prepares for the celebration of new life at Easter. Please join us for this Eucharistic celebration and optional foot washing.

Good Friday: The Way of the Cross

April 7, 7:00 pm— in person

Walk with Jesus the Via Dolorosa, following the traditional 14 Stations of the Cross. This gathering is a devotion to the Passion of Christ which recalls the series of events


Save the Date!

Adult Spiritual Formation



- * Our teachers are creative, nurturing, and passionate about young children.
