The Holiest of Seasons: Lent, Holy Week & Easter



March 17: The Fifth Sundays of Lent—8:00 & 10:00 am

Greens on the altar and purple hangings mark these last two Sundays of the penitential season.

March 24: The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday — 8:00 am & 10:00 am

Holy Week begins with the blessing of the palms, Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and the dramatic reading of The Passion.

March 28: Maundy Thursday: Foot Washing, Agape Supper & Holy Eucharist - 6:00 pm

- The budget deficit in 2023 was less then anticipated.

- Questions were raised by the attendees in the areas of pledges, outreach spending, the parish directory, and lighting in and around the church. Many were addressed at the meeting and the resolution of other concerns is ongoing.
